Calvary Church of Roseville will be launching their purity ministry with The Battle on October 6, 2007. River Valley Church in Apple Valley on January 12, 2008, North Heights Lutheran Church of Arden Hills on January 19, 2008, and Maple Grove Evangelical Free Church will be launching their battles on February 2, 2008.

What about your church? Would you like to see a purity ministry in your church? It does not matter the size or location of the church. We partner with churches of all sizes and in all locales to launch purity ministries. One of our guiding principles, however, is to only go where we are wanted. We don't contact churches to ask if they would like to host a purity ministry. Our pattern for expansion involves prayer and waiting on the Spirit of God to open doors of opportunity. Typically God stirs a veteran of the purity ministry to contact his/her pastor who, in turn, contacts me. Our approach is to pray and wait to be invited to partner with a church rather than "selling" a purity ministry to them. This does not preclude spreading the word and letting pastors and church leaders know that we exist. But then we pray and wait to see whom the Lord has prompted to respond.

Sunday alone is not enough to see us through the week. *Our number two priority is the husband-wife relationship (for married couples).* We must continue to practice the good habits we developed in platoon in courting our wives. Get out the wedding album. Get out the wedding video. Read those chapters on serving our wives from Healing the Wounds of Sexual Addiction and Eternal Impact. *Our relationship with our children begins with our relationship with our wives, but does not end there.* Have dedicated on-on-one time with each of your children about every week or two. ***December's article will deal with our Godly relationships with Godly men***
